

What to Do Before and After the Auditor Arrives

1-day In-Person Course



COURSE DESCRIPTION

This module explores the complexities of grant audits, focusing on the two primary types that affect both granting agencies and grantee organizations. Participants will gain a solid understanding of the single audit required for grantees receiving over \$750,000 in federal funding, as well as the detailed audits conducted by awarding entities. The module provides clear insights into audit expectations, guiding participants in preparing and implementing effective compliance strategies. It covers the legislative and regulatory foundations of these audits in a straightforward manner, offering essential knowledge for successfully navigating the audit process. By the end of the module, participants will have the skills and knowledge necessary to facilitate a smooth and informed audit process in their organizations. The curriculum includes an overview of each audit type, what to expect during each audit, and the legislative and regulatory background, equipping organizations with the information needed when auditors arrive.
