

# Contract Auditing: A Review of Small Purchases to Open Contracts (3-day virtual course)



## **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (Cares) Act has increased the use of contracts at the Federal, State and Local government level. One of the challenges in contracting is to ensure that the prices being paid for goods and services are fair and reasonable. To achieve that end, the role of the auditor is essential. This course will deal with the auditor's role in contract auditing and will emphasize the knowledge and skills necessary to evaluate contract proposals and audit contractor billings.



## WHAT YOU WILL LEARN

#### The auditor will learn how to:

- Use the Federal Acquisition Regulations (FAR) and the Cost Accounting Standards to determine the allowability, allocability and reasonableness of costs;
- · Calculate indirect allocation rates and how they are applied to contracts;
- Evaluate contract proposals; and
- · Audit contract billings.
