





COURSE DESCRIPTION

This 3-day virtual course will provide information about how to access guidance on compliance, how to update program/project narratives and how to avoid financial pitfalls. In addition, this course will provide information about how to prepare a continuation application, the steps that need to be taken to make changes to the grant as well as the concept of carryover and explain how to prepare a carryover request. Get results using time-tested strategies and practical, hands-on tools to execute and succeed in providing the correct documentation You'll learn how to do post award actions and understand what the grantor is looking for in reports and audits. This course "builds" from each day to the next. Participants should plan to attend the entire course or risk becoming lost because they have skipped a session.

The structure of this course calls for 2-hour daily virtual sessions over a three-day period.

- Understand how to complete a continuation application (Forms, Budget and Progress)
- · Gain awareness on how to update their project/program narrative
- · Locate federal regulations applicable to grant recipients
- · Be aware of common financial management issues

- Have updates on reporting and audit requirements
